Civil Rights Complaint Procedure for Child Nutrition Programs

- 1. The complainant may file a complaint with the sponsor, Indiana Department of Education, or directly with USDA.
- 2. All Child Nutrition Program operators can use the <u>Civil Rights Complaint Log</u> to record any civil rights complaints regardless if the complaint is expressed in writing or verbally.
- The complainant or sponsor may file a complaint using the <u>Civil Rights</u>
 <u>Complaint Form</u>. Use of a Civil Rights complaint form must not be a prerequisite
 to an acceptance of a complaint. An acceptance of a complaint can occur
 without the use of the form.
- 4. The complainant should include the following in your complaint letter:
 - a. Your name, address, county of residency, email address (if available), and telephone number
 - b. The name, address, and telephone number of your attorney or authorized representative, if you are represented.
 - c. The basis of your complaint. The basis is what you believe was the motivating factor for the discrimination. For example, you may believe you were treated differently because of your race, color, national origin, sex (including gender identity and sexual orientation), age, or disability.
 - d. The date(s) that the incident(s) you are reporting as discrimination occurred.
 - e. The name of the individual(s) or entity you believe discriminated against you and the agency or recipient that employs that/those individual(s).
 - f. Location (including the county) of the incident.
 - g. The issue(s) of your complaint. The issue is a description of what happened, or the action that was taken by the individual(s) or agency that discriminated against you, resulting in some harm. Explain as clearly as possible what happened, why you believe it happened, and how you were discriminated against. Please include how other persons were treated differently from you, if applicable. If you were denied a benefit or service, please provide a copy of the denial letter. If you have documents to support the events you are reporting, provide a copy of the supporting documents.

5. All civil rights complaints, written or verbal, that are filed directly with the sponsor or with the Indiana Department of Education will be recorded in the complaint log and sent to USDA for investigation.

Important

- It is necessary that the information provided be sufficient to determine the identity of the agency or individual towards which the complaint is directed and to indicate the possibility of a violation.
- Anonymous complaints should be handled as any other complaints.
- In the event a complainant makes the allegations verbally or through a telephone conversation and refuses or is not inclined to place such allegations in writing, the person to whom the allegations are made shall write up the elements of the complaint for the complainant.

Any person alleging discrimination based on race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability has a right to file a complaint within 180 days of the date of the alleged discriminatory action.
